In between songs, Bob encouraged the church with words of exhortation, reminding us of who God is and how wonderful He is. He also urged those present to rest in the love and presence of Jesus. "I know Malaysians," he said. "You guys work hard. So rest. God takes your burdens. Rest in Jesus."

He said that when he was at one of the worst moments of his life, he wrote this song which became one of the most popular songs he has written:

VISIT TO HOUSE OF VICTORY



House of Victory is a non-profit organization, established with the purpose of providing community services, especially in the area of drug eradication and rehabilitation.

The youth of KLBC organized a trip to House of Victory on September 9 to be a channel of blessing and encouragement to the people undergoing rehabilitation and the full time workers. Besides that, this trip was also to educate the youth about drugs and their harmful effects. When we arrived, we were welcomed with open arms as they were so happy to have us visit them. We started with worship led by their worship team. Although the songs were simple and somewhat unfamiliar, the worship session was good and we could sense the presence of the Holy Spirit.

Later on, we were introduced by the emcee and the supervisor gave us a short speech on the different types of drugs and their abuse. The inmates performed their award winning skit portraying different ways people are tricked and trapped in drug abuse and addiction. The skit was so interesting and realistic that it scared us somewhat. We ended our visit by giving House of Victory a love gift and some groceries from KLBC as well as prayed for them and their ministry. We were also given a tour of their mini exhibition on different drugs found in the market and the advancement of drug abuse from inhaling glue to cocaine and ecstasy use.

After a simple lunch and some fellowship, we were shown around the premise and

the living quarters. They also explained the way they operate and the process of rehabilitation. The entire rehabilitation process takes a year and a half in total and the graduates can either find their way back into society or they can choose to serve full-time with the organization.

It was a very educational experience and exposure for the youth, as drugs are easily available if we know where to look. As recreational drugs are getting more common and drug abuse becoming more rampant, this trip has taught us to be vigilant for ourselves and to be aware of how we can help those around us who are trapped in addiction. One of them shared with me that he was happy and touched that we didn't treat him any different even though he was a drug addict, as people often classify them as a nuisance and danger to society. I went home being reminded that we are all sinners saved by grace alone and that God's love is for everyone – even those we may deem unworthy. God is love.
